To the Kittitas County Auditor

On Tuesday night, February 18th, 2014 very late into the night, I arrived home after much snow had fallen to find that Mt. Home Rd. and not been plowed and after trying but unable to get my car onto my road, I decided to park on the cross street, Yellowstone Rd. until morning, Wednesday, February 19th, 2014. The County snow removal normally comes after 7a.m. and I got up at 6a.m listening for the plow. At approx. 8:45 I heard them coming and ran out to my car to move it and found my door locks frozen. Within a couple of minutes the blower was across from me and moving to the end of the street. I worked diligently trying to get my locks to open but to no avail. Within a few minutes the blower was behind me, stopped approx. 20 yards back and Obviously annoyed. He could see I was having difficulty but I could see him in his cab yelling and flailing his arms around and I was gesturing that my locks were frozen.

After a couple of minutes he drove past me and after he passed he stopped, opened his door and YELLED, "do you know you're not supposed to park here"? I apologized and told him I was trying, he could see that, but my locks were frozen. The grader was headed down the street on the other side and I gestured to the blower operator give me 1 minute and I'll be out of here. I ran into my house, got some water to throw on my lock and ran

back out and to my shock, my car was "PACKED IN" on 3 sides: back, driver side, front and the under carriage and both machines were headed up the street. My car was packed in with blatant malice. I had to go to work and it was obvious the car was going nowhere. I started shoveling but very quickly it became obvious I would need help so the family across the street came out to dig. We shoveled for almost an hour but it was the hard packed, Seattle cement. We gave up, I went to work and we continued the task after 5p.m when I got off work. We had the whole crew digging again and we tried to pull it out with the neighbor's truck but it just wouldn't move and the clutch was being stressed. There was so much snow under the car. Another neighbor offered to pull it out with his tractor. We finally got it out but not without damage to the clutch. I had to have it towed to North Bend to be repaired.

I have lived on Yellowstone/Mt. Home Rd. for 10 years and have not experienced the rudeness of these two operators. We have always appreciated the work of snow removal. I was told that there were several new operators but that does not mean they can be rude or unhelpful.

We are a small community and helping one another in time of need is very important. At the beginning of the season the plow left huge berms in front of Mt. Home Rd. and all the driveways. Normally, the blower is right behind him but not for 3 days...For those of us without tractors it was a tasking job. When he showed up I asked him what happened and he was very apologetic and said equipment had broken down. Yes, it was inconvenient but we waited. Things happen, equipment

breaks down and locks freeze but we help each other: we are not malicious.

This should never have happen. My car should not have been damaged and circumstances beyond my control? What can I say! Broken equipment? It would have been gentlemanly to have the operator ask me if I needed help, not cause me damage and stress.

I respectfully ask for the damage to my car be paid by Kittitas County.
