BACKGROUND: On January 26, 2015, the Board of County Commissioners

approved Resolution 2015-015, authorizing the Chair to sign the Federal Transit Administration's FFY 2015 Certifications and Assurances, Groups 01-03. Federal Transit Administration is requiring that the County revise this to indicate compliance with all applicable provisions of Groups 01-24. Neil Caulkins, Deputy Prosecutor indicated

the County should comply as requested.

Kittitas County is the lead planning agency for Quad County Regional Transportation Planning Organization (QUADCO), and is duly authorized to be the recipient of planning grants from the Department of Transportation. Kittitas County received a Federal Transit Administration's (FTA) grant in 2014 to update QUADCO's Human Services

Transportation Plan and evaluate the program.

FTA requested that Kittitas County authorize signature on certifications and assurances indicating our compliance with all Federal statutes, regulations, Executive Orders, and administrative requirements applicable to its application made to and grants received from the Washington State Department of Transportation under 49

U.S.C. Sections 5309, 5311, 5316, and 5339.
