ACTION REQUESTED:

BOCC Chair Sign Program Agreement

BACKGROUND:

The DSHS Juvenile Rehabilitation Administration administers funds provided to juvenile courts to carry out programs structured to meet Disposition (sentencing) options. The 2009 Legislature approved a block grant approach for examination and implementation by 6/30/2010. This document is the initial implementation of the Block Grant funding process for the programs in place to accomplish the various Disposition alternatives. Previous contracts for those services have expired. This contract provides funding for our CJS (Consolidated Juvenile Services) Programs as well as for the Special Sex Offender Disposition Alternative (SSODA), Chemical Dependency Disposition Alternative (CDDA), and Community Juvenile Accountability Act (CJAA) and various Disposition options for qualifying offenders as well as E3SHB funding in the amount of \$12,305 for FY 2011. The availability of the Disposition options is required by statute. This funding is to provide the program services associated with the specific Disposition alternatives which we have been providing for years (how long depending upon the individual Disposition Alternative having been set in statute).

INTERACTION:

The County's Grant Reviewer has reviewed the document on behalf of the County Auditor's Office. The assigned DPA has reviewed the contract on behalf of the County Prosecutor's Office and given her approval to form. The agreement has also been reviewed and signed by the Honorable Michael E. Cooper, Presiding Superior Court Judge for Kittitas County in his administrative duties relative to the Superior Court, Juvenile Division.

RECOMMENDATION:

Have the BOCC Chair sign 3 copies of the County Program Agreement-Consolidated Contract FY 2011 DSHS Agreement # 1063-94523.

HANDLING:

Request JCA is provided all 3 originals of the signed contracts for submission to JRA, their signature and return of an original for County processing.
