WHEREAS, the total damages to public and private property from these disasters is in excess of \$50,000,000; and

WHEREAS, we can reduce risk and help make our communities more damage resistant by providing information to residents and property owners about actions they can take to prepare for floods; and

WHEREAS, the key to understanding the dangers of flooding is through education and awareness;


NOW, THEREFORE, we, the Kittitas County Board of County Commissioners do hereby proclaim the month of November, 2014 as


