WHEREAS, the Kittitas County Conservation District (hereinafter, the "District") has the administrative and technical expertise to implement the proposed project; and

WHEREAS, Kittitas County and the District have a mutual interest in undertaking such cooperative efforts; and

WHEREAS, Kittitas County and the District have agreed to enter into such an agreement under the terms and conditions of the attached Interlocal Cooperation Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Kittitas County requests to amend the attached Interlocal Cooperation Agreement – Amendment A, to extend the completion date from January 9, 2016 to January 9, 2017

WHEREAS, the Kittitas County Board of County Commissioners authorized the execution of this Interlocal Cooperation Agreement by action taken at a regular meeting; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Kittitas County, Washington authorizes the execution of the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement Amendment "A" with the Kittitas County Conservation District that is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT-AMENDMENT-A

Final Payment: Final payment of any remaining, or withheld, funds will be made upon submission by the Sub-Grantee within 60 days of completion of the project of the final report and an A-19, Voucher Distribution, and completion of all final inspections by the Department. Final payment also may be conditioned upon a financial review, if determined necessary by the Department. Adjustments to the final payment may be made following any audits conducted by the Department, Washington State Auditor's Office, the United States Inspector General, or their authorized representatives.

Per Pre-Disaster Mitigation program guidance, no cost overruns will be funded. If costs exceed the maximum amount of FEMA funding approved, the Applicant shall pay the costs in excess of the approved budget.
