2010 OPERATING AND FINANCIAL PLAN

This Annual Financial and Operating Plan (Operating Plan), is hereby made and entered into by and between the Kittitas County Sheriff's Office, hereinafter referred to as the Cooperator, and the U.S. Forest Service, Okanogan-Wenatchee National Forest, hereinafter referred to as the Forest Service, under the provisions of Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement #09-LE-11061700-022 executed on April 22, 2009. This Operating Plan is made and agreed to as of the last date signed below and is for the period beginning January 1, 2010 and ending December 31, 2010.

I. GENERAL:

A. The following individuals shall be the designated and alternate representative(s) of each party, so designated, to make or receive requests for special enforcement activities:

B. Reimbursement for patrol activities (Section II) and Fire Emergencies (Section V-B-2) shall be at the following rates, unless specifically stated otherwise in modifications to this Operating Plan. These rates reflect actual costs to the Cooperator.

 Officer Wages: Between January 1, 2010 and December 31, 2010 a rate of \$55.00 per hour will be paid for patrol work. This figure includes salary (base time only), fringe benefits, vehicle mileage, operational costs, officer supplies and equipment, etc. The majority of work activity should occur between the months of February and November. Patrol activity during the months of December and January will occur upon concurrence of the Forest Service and the Cooperator as needs for such services are identified. Whenever the assigned Deputy is not performing Forest Service patrol, or is on special assignment by the Sheriff, those days/hours will not be billed to the Forest Service for reimbursement. This agreement has no overtime built into it. Search and Rescue efforts on National Forest are reimbursable for the assigned Deputy, base time only.

Each day will include breaks as allowed by Union contract. Reimbursement for the services provided will be based upon the hours displayed as work, annual leave and sick leave days, and the monthly or quarterly billings must reflect this.

a. For Fire Emergencies (Section V-B-2): the above flat rate will be applied to all hours worked (both regular and overtime).

b. **Equipment:** Use and reimbursement rates for any equipment other than patrol cars will need to be approved in advance by modification of this Operating Plan.

II. PATROL ACTIVITIES:

A. Time schedules for patrols will be flexible to allow for emergencies, other priorities, and day-to-day needs of both the Cooperator and the Forest Service. Ample time will be spent in each area to make residents and visitors aware that law enforcement officers are in the vicinity. Timely reports and/or information relating to incidents or crimes that have occurred on NFS lands should be provided to the Forest Service as soon as possible.

B. Cooperator agrees to:

1. Assign a fully trained Kittitas County Sheriff's Deputy to provide law enforcement patrols on National Forest lands. Throughout the year patrol hours

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will focus on Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday's. Between the months of May and October, patrols will include holidays or as mutually agreed to in writing by the Cooperator and the Forest Service.

Patrols should be performed in the following emphasis areas:

a. Developed Campgrounds, Picnic and Boat Launch Areas

Coverage should be at varied times with both day and night patrols, visible to the public with no set pattern. Some emphasis patrols should occur between the hours of 2:00 p.m. and 12:00 midnight. The objective is to provide security for the forest visitor and to establish a visible presence to discourage vandalism, harassment and other unacceptable behavior in the campgrounds.

b. Trailheads

Coverage will be provided at various times of day and night with no set pattern. The objective of this coverage is to establish a visible presence, provide security to forest visitors and prevention of vandalism, harassment and other unacceptable behavior.

Undeveloped Campgrounds

These sites are numerous and patrols should provide coverage at varied times without any set pattern. Some emphasis patrols should occur between the hours of 2:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. The objective is to establish a presence and prevent vandalism and provide for public safety and order.

d. Forest User Contacts

Patrols should include personal contacts with the public as the opportunity occurs. It should include campers, hunters, fishermen, firewood cutters, ORV/ATV operators, and other recreationists.

- 2. When requested by the Forest Service, the Cooperator agrees to dispatch additional Deputies, within manpower capabilities, to unforeseen or emergency situations at no cost to the Forest Service.
- The Cooperator will furnish the Forest Service copies of reports for incidents occurring on National Forest System Lands. These reports include but are not limited to vehicle accidents, fatality accidents and search and rescues.

C. Forest Service agrees to:

Reimburse Cooperator upon receipt of satisfactory statements of expenditures in accordance with the agreed upon rates listed in Section I-B.

D. The Parties mutually agree:

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Officer(s) assigned to work under the provisions of this agreement will be sworn employees of the Kittitas County Sheriff's Office and be mutually acceptable to both parties. The Officer(s) must meet POST standards for the State of Washington.

Total reimbursement for patrol activities shall not exceed the amount of: \$56,750.00

III. TRAINING:

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed the amount of: \$0

IV. EQUIPMENT:

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed the amount of: \$0

V. SPECIAL ENFORCEMENT SITUATIONS:

A. Special Enforcement Situations includes but is not limited to: Fire Emergencies, Drug Enforcement, and certain Group Gatherings.

B. Funds available for special enforcement situations vary greatly from year to year and must be specifically requested and approved prior to any reimbursement being authorized. Requests for funds should be made to the Forest Service designated representative listed in Item I-A of this Operating Plan. The designated representative will then notify the Cooperator whether funds will be authorized for reimbursement. For non-fire emergencies, if funds are authorized, the parties will then jointly prepare a revised Operating Plan. For fire emergencies, see Section VI-B-2 below.

1. Drug Enforcement:

This will be handled on a case by case basis. The request will normally come from the Patrol Captain; however it may come from the Special Agent in Charge or their designated representative. Deputies assigned to the incident will coordinate all of their activities with the designated officer in charge of the incident. Reimbursement shall be made at the rates specified in Section I-B-1. Activities associated with drug enforcement will be identified separately on the billings supplied by the Sheriff.

2. Fire Emergency:

During emergency fire suppression situations and upon request by the Forest Service pursuant to an incident resource order, the Cooperator agrees to provide special services beyond those provided under Section II-B, within the Cooperator's resource capabilities, for the enforcement of State and local laws related to the protection of persons and their property. The Cooperator will be compensated at the rate specified in Section I-B-1; the Forest Service will specify times and schedules. Upon concurrence of the local Patrol Captain or their designated representative, an official from the Incident Management Team assigned to the fire may make such a request and specify such times and schedules. Upon approval by the Forest Service or Incident Management Team managing the incident, Cooperator personnel assigned to an incident where meals are provided will be entitled to such meals. 5

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3. Group Gatherings/Other Situations:

When mutually agreed to in advance, The Sheriff will assist with enforcement and management of large group gatherings. This includes but is not limited to situations which are normally unanticipated or which typically include very short notice, large group gatherings such as rock concerts, demonstrations, and organizational rendezvous. Upon authorization by a Forest Service representative listed in Section I-B for requested services of this nature, reimbursement shall be made at the rates specified in Section I-B-1; and shall be identified separately on billings supplied by the Sheriff. Deputies assigned to this type of incident will normally coordinate their activities with the designated officer in charge of the incident.

VI. BILLING:

A. Availability of Funds: Funds in the amount of \$56,750.00 are currently available for patrol activities under this Operating Plan through **December 31, 2010**. Any Forest Service obligations beyond this amount are contingent upon the availability of appropriated funds from which payment can be made. No payment for any services performed after **December 31, 2010** can be made until additional funds are made available to the Forest Service. Any changes in fund amount or performance period must be agreed to in advance via formal modification of this agreement. After December 31, 2010, any remaining funds from the 2010 Financial and Operating Plan will become unavailable and will be de-obligated by the Forest Service.

B. **Billing**: The Cooperator will prepare an itemized statement for each invoice submitted to the Albuquerque Service Center. The statement will be in sufficient detail to allow the Forest Service to verify reimbursable expenditures authorized under Sections II and V. The statement shall be certified by the Sheriff, Undersheriff or Civil Deputy as being correct and proper. The Cooperator will submit invoices for reimbursement of services provided under Section II of this agreement monthly or quarterly, at the discretion of the Cooperator to:

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The Cooperator will be listed and maintain currency in the Central Contractor Registration database accessible through the internet at http://www.ccr.gov. The Cooperator will notify the Forest Service of any changes of their applicable account numbers or banking information to help ensure prompt payment.

1. Billing for Drug Enforcement, Group Gatherings/Other Situations: For reimbursement of services provided under Sections V-B-1 and V-B-3 of this agreement, billing instructions will be specified in a revised/modified Operating Plan.

2. Billing for Fire Emergencies: For reimbursement of services provided under Section V-B-2 of this agreement, the following billing procedure will be used:

a. The billing for each incident shall include individual employee times and their agreement rate. Such times will be documented on Crew Time Reports, shift tickets or other agreed upon form, and must be approved by incident management personnel.

b. Incident management personnel will prepare an Emergency Use Invoice and, upon concurrence of the Cooperator, will submit the invoice for payment along with all required documentation using normal incident business procedures.

c. The designated representative, IMT official, or a designated Forest Incident Business official will approve the invoice and submit to the Albuquerque Service Center, Incident Finance, for payment along with a copy of the current Operating Plan.

Original billing documentation will be maintained by the Forest Service in the appropriate fire documentation boxes or with appropriate incident management personnel. The Cooperator will maintain copies of all such documentation.
