9	WHEREAS, in November of 2009, the Washington State Building Code Council							
10	completed the adoption of the Washington State Energy Code 2009 edition; and							
11	WHEREAS, the aforementioned building code and amendments are mandated by the							
12	State to become effective January 1, 2011; and							
13	WHEREAS, a copy of the code proposed for adoption by reference was filed with the							
14	Kittitas County Auditor at least 10 days before the potential adoption; and							
15	WHEREAS, 10-days' notice was given before the public hearing; and							
16	WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on February 15 <sup>th</sup> , 2011 to consider the adoption of							
17	the Washington State Energy Code 2009 edition; and							
18	WHEREAS, at said public hearing on February 15 <sup>th,</sup> 2011 the Board of County							
19	Commissioners adopted the aforementioned building code; and							
20	NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of County Commissioners,							
21	after due deliberation and in the best interest of the public, does hereby approve the amendments							
22	to Title 14 of Kittitas County Code as rewritten below, the red-line version to which is shown on							
23	Attachment A.

2	<b>14.04.010 Adoption of referenced codes.</b> Kittitas County hereby adopts the following codes, as amended by the Washington State Building Code Council pursuant to RCW 19.27 for the purpose of establishing rules and regulations for the
