STARKOVICH, Gary W.

Fire Management Officer: Mt Hood National Forest, Bear Springs Ranger District

I developed comprehensive fire management plans for protection of valuable resources including longrange plans for fire prevention, and plans involving fire suppression, tactics, and strategy based on advanced knowledge of fire behavior, ground conditions, local weather history etc. I supervise the collection, summarization and compilation of data involving hazards and risks, critical environmental situations essential for effective control of fire on the district.

I contacted officials of industrial operations, local, county, State of Oregon, BIA and organized groups of forest users to enlist their cooperation in preventing, reporting and suppressing fires.

The Bear Springs District has approximately 500,000 visitor days per year, this resulted in maintaing a good strong full time prevention program. This consisted of educating the users of 19 designated campgrounds in an area on hours drive from the Portland metro area. On most weekends these campgrounds overflow into dispersed areas. I also administered a firewood permit system issuing permits to cut firewood in high hazard areas. Both of these programs required a sizable signing program and constant administration.

I initiated law enforcement and trespass investigations as they relate to fire management, and coordinated activities with the Wasco and Clackamas County Sheriffs Dept., Oregon State Police and the Oregon State Forestry. I posses a State of Oregon fire warden certificate and am a qualified fire investigator.

I developed and implemented the Districts complex fuels management program. I critically analyzed and recommended the most practical and economical means of treatment for a large annual accumulation of logging, precommercial thinning and site preparation slash. I also directed the broadcast burning or burning of piled fuels on approximately 4,000 acres annually. Coordinated with other District personnel responsible for resource programs to insure that necessary management criteria were met. This included modifying existing treatment practices and techniques as well as developing different ones.

I was instrumental in implementing an underburning program on the District to reduce man made and natural fuel accumulations. The program consisted of : 600 acres of underburning precommercial thinning slash, 100 +acres natural underburning and 600 acres of burning of meadows. The range improvement meadow burning occured in the spring and fall, this resulted in a reduction of unwanted brush species and improving the paletability of the grasses. To accomplish this burning I collected and interpreted a complex assortment of topographic and fire behavior factors necessary to insure that planned burning and silvicultural objectives were met. Most of this type of burning is done in mixed conifer stands and flame heights and BTU's are critical to their survival.

I represented fire management as a full member of the Districts Management Team in writing Environmental Analysis Reports using a interdisciplinary decision making process.

Average yearly program 1,000 acres of clear cut slash, 500 acres of machine piling, 200 acres of handpiling. I developed and executed the Burn plans, the prescriptions were developed by me at planning phase of a timber sale. During this period of time I started experimenting with natural fire I burned meadows, fuels under old growth stands and was the first on the Willamette to switch from the practice of Fall burning of clearcuts to Spring burning. I was also responsible for supervising and directing the fire suppression resources on the Ranger District.
