

Wild Horse Wind Farm DNR Radio Communications Tower.

Project Scope: DNR plans to place a radio communication tower adjacent to the Wild Horse Wind Farm situated between existing communications towers owned and operated by AT&T and the Washington State Patrol (WSP).

The project will result in the placement of a precast concrete building well as a communication tower placed on a concrete pad designed to support the tower, within the four corners designated on the picture.

- DNR has completed the Department of Archeology and Historic Preservation (DAHPP) and Tribal consultation in accordance with Executive Order #21-02.
- DNR has also completed a geotechnical soils analysis to determine the correct foundation structure for the antenna. The building specifications allow it to be placed on a crushed stone base that meet specific compaction requirements.
- No need for water or sewage disposal, only connecting to existing electric.
