Hello Chace.

This consult is in reference to Conditional Use Permits ACU-23-00004 ACX. Ground disturbing activities include the construction of a large building (12000 FT^2) with additional buildings planned for construction. There are other buildings on the property and the limited "narrative" did not provide a detailed work plan for the scope of the project.

This undertaking is located within the CCT Traditional Territories. We request any undertakings, particularly those involving ground disturbing activities, to have an IDP in place prior to implementation.

The proposed project lies within the traditional territory of the Moses-Columbia Tribe, 1 of the 12 constituent tribes of the Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation (CTCR), which is governed by the Colville Business Council (CBC). The CBC has delegated to the Tribal Historic Preservation Officer (THPO) the responsibility of representing the CTCR with regard to cultural resources management issues throughout the traditional territories of all of the constituent tribes under Resolution 1996-29. This area includes parts of eastern Washington, northeastern Oregon, the Palus territory in Idaho, and south-central British Columbia.

If ground disturbing activities are to be conducted, such as the building construction, installation of a septic system, or the scraping of a driveway, a cultural resource surface survey and sub-surface testing of the area in and directly around the proposed ground disturbance are recommended as a surface observation will not be an accurate assessment of the existent potential for subsurface cultural deposits. This test should be to the terminal depth of the septic installation to ensure the totality of the presence or absence of cultural material.

There are known cultural resources of historic significance nearby and this particular parcel is considered. High Risk for an inadvertent discovery according to the DAHP predictive model. This parcel and section has not been previously surveyed and a preliminary archaeological investigation would be prudent.

Due to the previous development and the clearly impermeable surfaces nearby CCT requests a cultural resource survey prior to implementation and then a cultural resource monitor during to the implementation of ground disturbing activities and that during implementation that there be an inadvertent discovery plan or (IDP) in place to ensure compliance with all Section 106 and relevant cultural resource laws both federally and to the state of Washington.

So long as everything that was submitted in the application is true. Public Health requirements for ACU-23-00004 ACX are as follows:

The parcel has a current on-site septic system permitted with Public Health for a bathroom only inside a shop. If no additions or alterations to this system are planned, then no on-site septic permit would be required through Public Health. If any additions or alterations are planned the system would need to be brought to current state and local standards. We would recommend the septic tank be pumped and the system inspected by a qualified individual prior to use.

The parcel is currently serviced by a well. Public Health has no requirements for water however would recommend a nitrate and bacteriological test.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the Notice of Application for the ACX. We have reviewed the application and have the following comments.

Water Quality

Project with Potential to Discharge Off-Site

If your project anticipates disturbing ground with the potential for stormwater discharge offsite, the NPDES Construction Stormwater General Permit is recommended. This permit requires that the SEPA checklist fully disclose anticipated activities including building, road construction and utility placements. Obtaining a permit may take 38-60 days.

The permit requires that a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (Erosion Sediment Control Plan) shall be prepared and implemented for all permitted construction sites. These control measures must be able to prevent soil from being carried into surface water and storm drains by stormwater runoff. Permit coverage and erosion control measures must be in place prior to any clearing, grading, or construction.

In the event that an unpermitted Stormwater discharge does occur off-site, it is a violation of Chapter 90.48 RCW, Water Pollution Control and is subject to enforcement action.

Water Resources

In Washington State, prospective water users must obtain authorization from the Department of Ecology before diverting surface water or withdrawing ground water, with one exception. Ground water withdrawals of up to 5,000 gallons per day used for single or group domestic supply, up to 5,000 gallons per day used for industrial purposes, stock watering, and for the irrigation of up to one-half acre of non-commercial lawn and garden are exempt from the permitting process. Water use under the RCW 90.44.050 exemption establishes a water right that is subject to the same privileges, restrictions, laws and regulations as a water right permit or certificate obtained directly from Ecology.
