Dear Sirs/Madams:

This writing is to voice my opinion of the Teanaway Solar Reserve project for which a meeting is being held in Ellensburg this evening; and ask this writing be included as a matter of public record.

#### I fervently support an approval to permit the Teanaway Solar Reserve.

The basis of the publication circulated by Citizens Alliance for a Rural Teanaway is unambiguous...there is no opposition to the project – just a personal preference that it be located in someone else's back yard. Indeed their publication cites many physical parameters of the project and, knowing all that, they support a location... just further east.

It is unfortunate that the opposition group is so ignorant of the tax credits – whether State or Federal and of the facts surrounding solar energy generation.

The truth is that the tax credits are DATE sensitive and by stalling this matter, there is the potential to lose the tax credits. As an accountant and business consultant, I can speak to the merit of utilizing tax credits as a factor to proceed on a large capital expenditure. The absense thereof could mean the project would not "pencil out". Therefore, I encourage the permits to be issued quickly.

As to the opponents complaint of solar panels being placed where there is snow and short days in the winter - at our latitude in North America the days are shorter in the winter; both in Vantage and the Teanaway. As to snow, the fact is that electrical components perform BETTER in cool weather.

We installed a solar system less than two weeks ago roughly one mile from the Teanaway and have already generated over 166 kwh of energy. We used our money, our research, and our land to accomplish this. We have neighbors who live at a higher elevation and can see our system – they can also see our house, our barn, our horses, etc. Do you see what I'm saying? How would it be just for someone, who because they can see our property, to therefore have hegemony on what we can legally place on our property? Should they be able to say that we can only have ponies and no Clydesdales?

Our neighbor one property north of us is in the process of putting in their solar system and wind turbine. Just as I believe that our neighbors do not and did not have the right prevent our solar system from being implemented – neither do we have the right to impeed our neighbor from installing theirs...with their money, choosing what their research proved most prudent, and using their own land.

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
