ADDENDUM---Wildlife List

Intro: My primary purpose in living in this area is to enjoy and preserve its natural environment, which is habitat to many species. The following list includes wildlife observed on or near our parcels which are located on the other side of upper Emerick Road to the northeast of Hidden Point (HP). I offer it to show the rich diversity of the area's wildlife that would be repelled and otherwise affected by the traffic, noise and other intrusions of HP vacationers, as many as 50 at a time. While I am not submitting a list of native plant species on and around our land, I wish to add that, since the fire, and with my help of removing knapweed and other invasive plants along Emerick Road, native grasses and plants have been competing successfully and playing their part in restoring habitat. The unmitigated land-clearing and road construction by HP, where tumbleweed and other invasive plants are spreading, threatens that progress. Below, Lady Slipper Orchid (*Cypripedium montanum*) on our parcel across from HP.
