I have signed the letter submitted by Pat Galloway and am in support of her objections to the Hidden Point LLC VRBO-complex. I oppose this development.

You probably are also aware that the land owners contiguous along Swauk Creek have completed extensive conservation efforts and improvements with easements held by Forterra and The Nature Conservancy all the way down to where Swauk Creek enters the Yakima River. You are probably also aware that Hidden Valley was severely affected by the Taylor Bridge Fire in August of 2012. Conservation, preservation, and careful land management has been our greatest priority. As such, I support my brother Bruce Coe's concern that whatever takes place on Lookout Mountain not interfere with our ability and flexibility to protect the land that has been in our family for 54 years.
