I have lived on this property for 14 years and this is the first I am hearing about this project that will have dire affects on my family's well being, our health, our water quality, and the value of our property. I am extremely disappointed that it appears that this permit application was being fast tracked and cloaked in only a bureaucratic notification process with no discussion with the property and homeowners adversely affected by this project.

The SEPA environmental checklist states "the storage can give an odor". What is the amount of odor allowed before the county buys my family home at todays market value? Values will plummet with the smell that will for sure waft a mile downhill to my families home. Again in the SEPA Air section they state they "will minimize odors from the site", therefore it is

known the site will have odor. Kittitas County needs to protect existing homeowners.

In the SEPA under Animals, is the examples an actual list of animals near or on the site? It also states this is not known to be a migration route. I question this since I have to listen to air cannons every night to try to break the Elk Migrating to the area farmers fields and damage tags are issued by WDFW every year for this area adjacent to the projected site.

I strongly urge you to deny this application until you can have a full discussion with the impacted property owners and/or consider another location.
