MITIGATED DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE

File: SEPA Checklist (SE-21-00031)

Mundy SEPA Application

Description: Bill Mundy is proposing to do road improvements and a stormwater management system

including 626 cubic yards of cut and 2,329 cubic yards of fill. The SEPA application is associated with Kittitas County Public Works Grading Permit GP-21-00031. The project is proposed on a site that is zoned Agricultural 5 and Forest and Range within a Rural Residential and Rural

Working Land Use designation.

Lead Agency: Kittitas County Community Development Services

The lead agency for this proposal has determined that it will not have a probable significant adverse impact on the environment. An environmental impact statement (EIS) is not required under RCW 43.21C.030(2)(c) and WAC 197-11. This decision was made after review of a completed environmental checklist, site visit with state agencies and other information on file with the lead agency. This information is available to the public on request or can be viewed at the Kittitas County Community Development Services website at: http://www.co.kittitas.wa.us/cds/land-use/default.aspx under "Miscellaneous SEPA Applications" using the file number "SE-21-00031 Mundy."

The lead agency has determined that certain mitigation measures are necessary in order to issue a Mitigated Determination of Non-Significance (MDNS) for this proposal. Failure to comply with mitigation measures identified hereafter will result in the issuance of a Determination of Significance (DS) for this project. The mitigation measures include the following:

- 1) Any grading over 100 cubic yards of material requires a grading permit through Kittitas County Public Works. Any grading over 500 cubic yards of material will require engineered grading and storm water plans. See Kittitas County Code chapter 14.05. The applicant shall not grade until their grading permit is issued. The applicant has applied for a grading permit. All conditions in the approved grading permit shall be adhered to.
- 2) Per KCC 14.05.110(8): Excavations shall not constrict or alter the existing flow of storm water, streams, or other historical flow.
- 3) All activities requiring permitting through the Department of Natural Resources shall be obtained prior to additional work on site.

- 4) All culverts and their proposed locations must be approved by Kittitas County Public Works prior to installation.
- 5) Communication shall be made with Kittitas County's Code Enforcement Officer when all appropriate permits have been issued before additional work can take place.
- 6) Kittitas County Public Works must inspect and approve all work done prior to additional work starting.
- 7) An NPDES Construction Stormwater Permit shall be obtained from the Department of Ecology prior to any additional work being completed. Conditions from this permit must be adhered to in the field.
- 8) The proposed roadway shall not increase the existing stormwater runoff onto adjacent properties. In the event of ditch scour or flow onto adjacent properties, the applicant will be required to construct mitigations suitable to Kittitas County Public Works.
- 9) No channelization of stormwater runoff shall occur except for natural flow channels and culverts approved by Public Works.
- 10) Should ground disturbing or other activities related to the grading and clearing result in the inadvertent discovery of cultural or archaeological materials, work shall be stopped in the immediate area and contact be made with the Washington State Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP). Work shall remain suspended until the find is assessed and appropriate consultation is conducted. Should human remains be inadvertently discovered, as dictated by Washington State RCW 27.44.055, work shall be immediately halted in the area and contact made with the coroner and local law enforcement in the most expeditious manner possible.

This MDNS is issued under WAC 197-11-355; the lead agency will not act on this proposal for 10 working days. Any action to set aside, enjoin, review, or otherwise challenge this administrative SEPA action on the grounds of noncompliance with the provisions of Chapter 43.21 RCW, shall be commenced on or before **April 28, 2022 at 5 pm.**
