WHEREAS, the key to understanding the dangers of flooding is through education and awareness;

NOW, THEREFORE, we, the Kittitas County Board of County Commissioners do hereby proclaim the month of November, 2016 as

FLOOD AWARENESS MONTH

We encourage all residents living, working or traveling through flood-prone areas to join us in developing a flood preparedness plan for themselves and their families.
