


RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE EXECUTION OF AN AMENDMENT TO AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE KITTITAS COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT AND THE WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF ECOLOGY

- WHEREAS, Kittitas County, through the Kittitas County Public Health Department (KCPHD), is charged with the preservation, promotion, and improvement of health in the County; and
- WHEREAS, KCPHD and the Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) entered into an Agreement dated July 10, 2015 for the purpose of providing to KCPHD coordinated prevention grant funding to monitoring and enforcement activities at solid waste facilities, to maintain a syringe education and exchange program, to maintain an unsecured load surveillance, enforcement, education, and compliance program at solid waste facilities, and for other purposes; and
- WHEREAS, the Agreement allows for amendments that are in writing and agreed to by both the parties; and
- WHEREAS, the Parties desire to amend the Agreement by amending the scope of work to allow for the reimbursement of trainings, conferences and memberships related to task activities as detailed in the amendment attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
- NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners of Kittitas County, Washington, authorizes the Kittitas County Public Health Department to execute an amendment to an Agreement with the Washington State Department of Ecology that is attached hereto, and incorporated herein by reference.

PURPOSE: To amend the above-referenced agreement (AGREEMENT) between the state of Washington Department of Ecology (ECOLOGY) and Kittitas County Public Health (RECIPIENT) for the KCPHD Solid Waste Enforcement (PROJECT).

To amend the scope of work to allow for the reimbursement of trainings and conferences and memberships related to task activities.

IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED that the AGREEMENT is amended as follows:

Task Cost: \$45,798.27

Task Title: Solid Waste Enforcement

1

Task Description:

The RECIPIENT intends to monitor solid waste handling facility compliance with applicable state solid waste regulations. The RECIPIENT will monitor 8 active solid waste permitted facilities, 1 facility that is in post closure status, and 7 exempt facilities for compliance; investigate solid waste related complaints; offer technical assistance regarding solid waste issues; conduct secured load ordinance education events; as well as community syringe education and collection events.

The RECIPIENT expects to investigate solid waste related complaints or concerns. The RECIPIENT expects to offer technical assistance about solid waste regulations and how to prevent violations, and enforce as necessary. The RECIPIENT expects to provide public education about proper handling and disposal methods.

With written approval from Ecology the recipient may request reimbursement for attendance at trainings and conferences and memberships fees related to task activities.

Task Goal Statement:

To protect human health and the environment by monitoring compliance with state and local solid waste regulations, and enforcing compliance when necessary.

Task Expected Outcome:

The RECIPIENT expects to complete at least one inspection per calendar year at each permitted solid waste facility or site identified under this activity.

Task Title: Syringe Education and Exchange Events

Task Description:

RECIPIENT will maintain a Syringe Education and Exchange surveillance program located in Kittitas County. RECIPIENT will provide designated locations for syringe disposal and education regarding safe sharps handling and disposal according to local and state regulations. Task costs will include staff hours, educational materials, and sharps containers for proper and healthy diversion of hazardous materials as well as code compliance.

With written approval from Ecology the recipient may request reimbursement for attendance at trainings and conferences and memberships fees related to task activities.

Task Goal Statement:

RECIPIENT will educate Kittitas County residents on the importance of properly disposing sharps in effort to reduce the number of improperly disposed of sharps from residences in Kittitas County that pose a potential health risk and perceived threat to the waste generators, public and workers in the waste and recycling industry.

Task Expected Outcome:

The number sharps that are properly disposed of from residents in Kittitas County will be increased.

Task Title: Unsecured Loads Community Outreach

Task Description:

RECIPIENT will maintain an unsecured load surveillance, enforcement, education, and compliance program located at solid waste facilities in Kittitas County. This program will include educational materials focused on reducing violations of the Kittitas County unsecured load ordinance and informational events that involve face-to-face interactions with the public. This task will include costs covering staff hours and the production of educational materials for this program.

With written approval from Ecology the recipient may request reimbursement for attendance at trainings and conferences and memberships fees related to task activities.

Task Goal Statement:

RECIPIENT will maintain an unsecured load surveillance, education, and enforcement program with the overall goal of increasing the percentage of secure loads that come into solid waste facilities & prevent accidental litter from becoming a public and environmental health nuisance.

Task Expected Outcome:

The percentage of secured loads entering solid waste facilities will be increased, accidental litter from unsecured loads will be decreased, and public and environmental health degradation and nuisances will be prevented.
