

EVENT APPLICATION PROCESS

- 1. Submit a completed Event Application and materials to the Kittitas County Commissioners Office at least 60 days prior to the event. There are several departments who review the Event Applications and make their determination based upon the application, written plans and documentation that has been provided. Please note that additional permits may be required in addition from individual departments including: the Fire Marshal, Public Health, Environmental Health, Community Development Services, and the Public Works Department. A \$200.00 permit fee is to be submitted at the time of application for each event. Applications will not be processed until the permit fee has been received.
- 2. Once a special event has been approved by the County Commissioners, the site and facilities may need to be inspected by County officials (including but not be limited to the Fire Marshal, Sheriff's Department, and Public Health Department) up to five days in advance <u>prior</u> to opening to the general public. This is to ensure that you are complying with the stated plans upon which the approval was made. If you fail to comply with those requirements, your permit may be revoked and the event closed.
- 3. Depending upon the nature and scope of the proposed event, other permits may be required as determined through the application process (liquor license, etc.). Some events may require approval from other agencies or jurisdictions.

- 4. Permittee covenants and agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the County, its officers, agents and employees from any and all claims actions, damages, liability, cost and expense, including reasonable attorney fees in connection with or occasioned, in whole or in part by any act or omission of Permittee, its officers, agents, employees, customers or licenses, or arising from or out of Permittee's failure to comply with any provision of the Event Permit granted as a result of this application, regardless of whether it is alleged or proven that the acts or omissions of the County, its officers, agents or employees caused or contributed hereto.
- 5. Insurance Requirement: A Certificate of Insurance specifically naming "Kittitas County" as an additional insured in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence and a \$2,000,000.00 aggregate coverage must be included with the Event Application. The County Prosecutor's office may require a greater amount if it is determined to be necessary for the proposed event.
- 6. Written statements signed by the applicant and property owner allowing permission to enter the event site for inspections and stating responsibility for the event and compliance with the codes **is required** as part of the written documentation to be submitted at the time of application.
- 7. Before applying for an event it is encouraged that you schedule a time to meet with County departments so they may assist with questions you may have prior to submitting your application.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

January 18, 2013

Central Washington University Ellensburg, Washington

We have audited the accompanying basic financial statements of Central Washington University, Kittitas County, Washington, as of and for the years ended June 30, 2012 and 2011 as listed in the table of contents. These financial statements are the responsibility of the University's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audits. We did not audit the financial statements of the Central Washington University Foundation, a blended component unit, which represents 3.5 percent, 5 percent, and 1.2 percent, respectively, of the assets, net assets and revenues of the University in 2012, and 3.5 percent, 5.1 percent, and 2.6 percent, respectively, of the assets, net assets and revenues of the University in 2011. Those financial statements were audited by other auditors whose reports thereon have been furnished to us, and our opinion, insofar as it relates to the amounts included for the Central Washington University Foundation, is based on the reports of other auditors.

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audits and the reports of the other auditors provide a reasonable basis for our opinion.

As discussed in Note 1, the financial statements of Central Washington University are intended to present the financial position, the changes in financial position, and, where applicable, cash flows of only that portion of the business-type activities of the State of Washington that is attributable to the transactions of the University. They do not purport to, and do not, present fairly the financial position of the State of Washington as of June 30, 2012 and 2011, the changes in its financial position, or, where applicable, its cash flows for the years then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

In our opinion, based on our audits and the reports of other auditors, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Central Washington University, Kittitas, County, Washington, as of June 30, 2012 and 2011, and the





changes in financial position and, where applicable, cash flows thereof for the years then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the management's discussion and analysis on pages 2 through 13 be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during the audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

The information identified in the table of contents as appendices to the financial statements on pages 34 through 37 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the basic financial statements of the University. Such information has not been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, accordingly, we do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on it.

Manastash Metric – The Drier Ride Bike Ride Century and Half Century Tour October 5, 2013 Ellensburg, Washington

Event Information

The Manastash Metric-The Drier Ride Bike Ride sponsored by the RSVP and Volunteer Center of Kittitas County will be held on October 5, 2013. RSVP and Volunteer Center is sponsored by Central Washington University.

Route

There will be two routes going on at the same time, a half century and century ride. The half century ride will go from Ellensburg around Thorp and back to Ellensburg. The century ride will go from Ellensburg to Cle Elum and back to Ellensburg. The route will utilize back roads in Kittitas County, Hwy 97 and Hwy 10. Please see the enclosed map and route detail. You may also visit the ride website at http://www.drier-ride.org.

The staging area/event start and finish will be held at Mt. Stuart Elementary School. The route will be marked with Dan Henry signs on the pavement as well as larger sign for riders at intersections and crossroads. Dan Henry signs will be marked with a chalk based non permanent paint. RSVP and Volunteer Center has notified and will work with the Washington State DOT office as well as the City of Ellensburg and Cle Elum.

All riders will check in at the staging area between 7:30-9:00 am October 5, 2013 at the same location. All riders will be given a numbered bib to wear for identification. The event will conclude at approximately 6:00 p.m.

The riders will not be on any major freeways during the event and we do not anticipate any congestion as riders will be spread out during the ride. The only major intersections riders will cross are controlled by stop lights and or stop signs. These are located at Water and University Way in Ellensburg and where 4th Street in South Cle Elum and 1st street in Cle Elum intersect.

Parking

Parking for participants and volunteers will be located at the Mt. Stuart School parking lot. There is adequate and safe off the road parking for volunteers at all of the rest stop locations.

Alcohol and Amplification

This is a non alcohol event and no amplification or music will be used.

Garbage and Recycling

Garbage cans will be provided at the staging area and all rest stop areas. All garbage will be picked up and hauled away after the event. Recyclable materials will be recycled. The follow end car will look for and pick up any garbage left by riders on the route immediately following the last rider.

Rest Stops

Rest stops will be provided for all riders with at least 3 volunteers at each rest stop. The rest stop will have a restroom provided, packaged food and bottled water, first aid and other supplies for the riders. All volunteers will wear gloves when handling food. Hand sanitizer will be available for volunteers and riders at the stops and in the portable potty units. Each rest stop that is located outside will have a 10 foot by 10 foot tent awning covering a table and supplies. All rest stop volunteers will have cell phone and be in constant contact with event coordinators, SAG wagons and have emergency phone numbers.

The rest stops will be located at the following areas:

Mt. Stuart School, outdoor restroom, outside food and beverage-event start/end

Corner of Thorp Cemetery and Watt Canyon Road (private residence) portable potty, food, beverage

Elk Heights Gravel Pit, potable potty, food, beverage

St. John the Baptist Church, Cle Elum,inside restroom, kitchen area, inside food, beverage

There will be a set up and lead truck that will circle the ride routes.

The Recycle Shop will have a Sag Wagon and serve as a bike doctor and drive the routes continuously throughout the day.

There will be a follow car to follow the last rider until he/she completes the ride. Another follow truck will tear down rest stops as the ride progresses and make sure garbage is picked up along the route.

Participant Safety

Safety for the participants and volunteers is our number one priority. We will work with all law enforcement departments, EMS and the Washington State DOT to discuss the route and anticipate any issues a head of time. There will be first aid kits at all rest stops and in the Sag Wagon.

All intersections and road crossings will be well marked with signage. Riders will be given the course route map prior to the ride and be aware of any last minute changes. Large orange "Bikes on the Roadway" signs will be placed on hwy 10 to notify cars of riders.

Staff and volunteers will be on the route throughout the day to ensure safety. All riders will be assigned a numbered bib to wear for identification for the event.

Staff and volunteers will have cell phone numbers and know what to do in the case of an emergency by attending an event training session prior to the event.

All participants will fill out a registration form and pay the entry fee. They will abide by the Washington Rules of the Road and wear approved bike helmets. They will read and sign the Acknowledgement of Risk, Hold Harmless Agreement and Rules and Regulation form. Participants 18 years and younger will have a parent or guardian sign the forms for them.
