This decision is based on our finding that:


The issue before the Board is the assessed value of land/improvements.

A hearing was held on November 26th, 2019. Those present: Chair- Jessica Hutchinson, Vice Chair Ann Shaw, Jennifer Hoyt, Clerk Taylor Crouch, and Assessor Mike Hougardy. No one present for the Appellant.

The Assessor stated this parcel has a good quality, fully functional steel frame barn. The replacement cost for this improvement would be much more than 26,460.

The Board of Equalization has decided due to the lack of comparable sales to suggest otherwise, the Board voted 3-0 to uphold the Assessor's value.
