Mr. Flory

I have recently reviewed your March 16, 2015 email on the use of temporary growing structures. Please also consider that the exemption only applies for six months.

A summary of the relevant sections is as follows:

. Temporary growing structures are generally exempt from the International Building Code regulations. Under Kittitas County Code section 14.04.010(1), this code is adopted and applied in this county.

But only <u>temporary</u> structures are given the limited exemptions to this code. (RCW 19.27.015(4); WAC 51-50-007). By definition, temporary is for no longer than one hundred and eighty days.

"Tents and other membrane structures erected for a period of less than one hundred eighty days shall comply with the International Fire Code. Those erected <u>for a longer period of time shall comply with applicable sections of this (the International Building) code</u>." (WAC 51-50-3103.1)

In other words, a hoop house needs a permit on the one hundred eighty first day.
