On behalf of the Washington State chapter of the Sierra Club, I am writing in support of the OneEnergy Renewables Iron Horse solar project in Kittitas County.

Sierra Club strongly supports the development of environmental responsible renewable energy. We have seen no major concerns about the siting of this project. We understand that the designated project land could be brought back into agricultural production after the useful life of this project has been reached. We know of no environmental impacts to water, land or wildlife from this project. We know the project developers have addressed all of the environmental and wildlife protection requirements.

We also know that this project is designed as a demonstration. We do not have any utility-scale solar projects in the State of Washington.
