2018 Naneum Creek Emergency Channel Maintenance Project

Request for SEPA, Critical Areas, and Shoreline Permit Exemptions

Dear Lindsey:

The intent of this letter is to request exemption status for SEPA, Critical Areas Ordinances, and Shoreline Development Permits for the emergency channel maintenance project in Naneum Creek. The project will be undertaken by Kittitas County Public Works (County) and Kittitas Reclamation District (KRD). Documentation and justification for these exemptions are provided herein and in the enclosed information. The project will receive an expedited Hydraulic Project Approval (HPA) from Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW).

Also enclosed for your reference and use are project plans and photographs, and a Kittitas County Shoreline Exemption Permitting application.

Project Description


KRD and Kittitas County Public Works needs to prevent imminent damage to irrigation infrastructure by removing accumulated sediment and debris from Naneum Creek and armoring an eroded bank at the KRD intake structure. KRD needs to remove approximately 2,000 cy of blocking debris from Naneum Creek, in an area from the intake structure upstream approximately 350 feet. This section of the creek is completely blocked with sediment, and Naneum Creek flows are currently forced out of the channel and will cause further damage to the KRD NB canal.

In 2017, Kittitas County and KRD completed a joint project to remove the Bar 14 Road Bridge upstream of the NB intake and remove accumulated sediment and debris. Since that time, high water events have mobilized the upstream sediment that was held in place by the bridge for several years. Approximately 2,000 cubic yards of cobble and debris were mobilized and is now perched immediately above the NB intake structure and if not removed will mobilize into the intake structure and erosive flows will breach the canal intake.

In addition, the aggraded sediment is completely blocking the Naneum Creek channel upstream of the intake structure, which has forced flows into a bank of unconsolidated material protecting the right bank. This material has rapidly eroded, and now requires repair and large rock armor to protect the intake structure and prevent Naneum Creek from flanking the structure and breaching the NB Canal.

Approximately 60 linear feet of bank will be armored from the intake structure upstream, requiring approximately 27 cubic yards of armoring below the Ordinary High Water Mark.

The action needs to occur as soon as possible and will take less than 2 weeks once underway. The intent is to complete the project after the KRD North Branch Canal has stopped running (October 15) and prior to expected high water events. The bedload material removal and bank armoring needs completed before Naneum Creek water levels increase and flooding causes additional failure of infrastructure.

SEPA

Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 197-11-880 defines when emergency actions are exempted from the requirements of SEPA or the SEPA guidelines. Actions that must be undertaken immediately or within a time too short to allow full compliance with SEPA, to avoid an imminent threat to public health or safety, to prevent an imminent danger to public or private property, or to prevent an imminent threat of serious environmental degradation, shall be exempt. An emergency exemption can be granted by a lead agency when 1) an action is needed to avoid an imminent threat to public health or safety, public or private property, or to prevent serious environmental degradation; and 2) there is not adequate time to complete SEPA procedures.

This action meets these requirements. Due to the lack of channel capacity in Naneum Creek, the next high-water event will severely and catastrophically impact the KRD NB canal and intake structure. Typical fall flows are high enough to cause this damage, so the emergency action must occur as soon as possible.

In addition, WAC 197-11-800(3) Repair, remodeling, and maintenance activities, states: The following activities shall be categorically exempt: The repair, remodeling, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing private or public structures, facilities or equipment, including utilities, recreation, and transportation facilities involving no material expansions or changes in use beyond that previously existing; except that, where undertaken wholly or in part on lands covered by water, only minor repair or replacement of structures may be exempt.

The project meets the intent of this exemption as well, as the channel cleaning and maintenance is returning the stream to the condition before flooding and accumulated sediment. Removal of the material is a maintenance action specific to protection of the KRD intake structure.

Shoreline Development Permit

WAC 173-27-040(2)(b) and Kittitas County Code (KCC) 17B.07.030(2)(b) define actions which are exempt from substantial development permits under the Shoreline Management Act.

These codes state: The following developments shall not require substantial development permits: Normal maintenance or repair of existing structures or developments, including damage by accident, fire or elements. "Normal maintenance" includes those usual acts to prevent a decline, lapse, or cessation from a lawfully established condition. "Normal repair" means to restore a development to a state comparable to its original condition, including but not limited to its size, shape, configuration, location and external appearance, within a reasonable period after decay or partial destruction, except where repair causes substantial adverse effects to shoreline resource or environment. Replacement of a structure or development may be authorized as repair where such replacement is the common method of repair for

the type of structure or development and the replacement structure or development is comparable to the original structure or development including but not limited to its size, shape, configuration, location and external appearance and the replacement does not cause substantial adverse effects to shoreline resources or environment.

The emergency action is required due to damage by flood events and to restore the channel capacity of Naneum Creek prior to expected flooding. The action will restore Naneum Creek to the previous condition prior to sediment aggradation. There are no adverse effects to resources or the environment, as work will restore the channel, provide plantings and habitat mitigation as required by WDFW, and restore natural stream conditions compared to the current degraded condition.

Critical Areas

Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 36.70A.170 and 36.70A.060, and KCC Chapter 17A define the management of Critical Areas.

KCC 17A.03.020(5) states activities are exempt when: Reconstruction as a result of destruction by a natural disaster or disintegration over time, maintenance, or remodeling of structures, provided that such reconstruction, maintenance, or remodeling does not involve an expansion of the structure's footprint when located within a critical area. Any such activity shall nevertheless comply with the county's flood damage prevention ordinance, No. 93-18.

The action meets this exemption due to the reconstruction of the Naneum Creek channel within its original footprint. The project does not permanently impact wetlands or riparian habitat as defined in KCC 17A.07.010, and will result in restoring aquatic habitat and flood hazard protection.

Therefore with this submittal, Jacobs, as an agent for Kittitas County Public Works and KRD, is requesting exemptions from SEPA, Shoreline Development Permits, and Growth Management Act Critical Areas Ordinance permits for the proposed project. Please let me know of any questions, or if you require any additional information.

Dear Mr. Broadhead:

Thank you for the opportunity to assist in this matter.

I am in receipt of your letter dated October 4, 2018 requesting SEPA, Critical Areas Ordinance, and Shoreline Permit exemptions for the Kittitas County Public Works Nanaeum Creek Emergency Channel Maintenance project. I have reviewed the documentation submitted with your letter, and have made the following determinations:

SEPA

According to Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 197-11-800(3), the repair, remodeling, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing public structures, facilities, and equipment - including transportation facilities involving no material expansions or changes in use beyond that previously existing - shall be categorically exempt from SEPA requirements. As proposed, the stream would be restored to its previous condition that existed prior to flood related debris deposition, with no changes in use to the previously existing conditions. Therefore, the project is exempt from SEPA review.

In addition, WAC 197-11-880 allows emergency actions to be exempted from SEPA to avoid imminent threats to public health or safety, public or private property, and/or threats of environmental degradation. Currently, the condition of the Nanaeum Creek threatens the Kittitas Reclamation District intake in the event of a high flood event. Fall flows are often high enough to cause this kind of damage. Therefore, the project is also exempt from SEPA review under these provisions.

Critical Areas Ordinance

According to Kittitas County Code (KCC) 17.03.020, the following activities are exempt from Critical Areas Ordinance review:

- 3. Activities involving artificially created habitat, including but not limited to grass-lined swales, irrigation systems and drainage ditches, farm ponds, detention facilities such as ponds, and landscape features, including any adjacent riparian habitat created or resulting from these activities, except for wetlands or habitat areas created as mitigation.
- 4. Reconstruction as a result of destruction by a natural disaster or disintegration over time, maintenance, or remodeling of structures, provided that such reconstruction, maintenance, or remodeling does not involve an expansion of the structure's footprint when located within a critical area. Any such activity shall nevertheless comply with the county's flood damage prevention ordinance, No. 93-18. Emergencies that threaten the public health, safety and welfare, including

private or public property.

5. Emergencies that threaten the public health, safety and welfare, including private or public property.

The proposed reconstruction is a result of damage caused by flood events and erosion from Nanaeum Creek. The reconstruction would be located within the original footprint, and would create habitat and beneficially affect the shoreline area. In addition, the project is undertaken as an emergency measure to prevent damage to the Kittitas Reclamation District irrigation infrastructure. Therefore, the project is exempt from Kittitas County Critical Areas Ordinance review.

Shoreline Development Permit

While it appears that this project would be exempt from shoreline permitting requirements, KCC 17B.07.030(3)(b) requires that any person claiming an exemption from a shoreline substantial development permit shall submit an application in manner prescribed by the Shoreline Administrator. On October 4, 2018, Kittitas County Public Works submitted an application for Shoreline Exemption (SX-18-00025). That application is currently under review.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Removal of debris from Nanaeum Creek and restoration of shoreline area adjacent to the Kittitas Reclamation District Irrigation intake.

THIS DEVELOPMENT IS EXEMPT PURSUANT TO WAC 173-27-040(2)(b) and KCC 17B.07.030 (2) (b). A SHORELINE SUBSTANTIAL DEVELOPMENT PERMIT IS NOT REQUIRED FOR THIS PROJECT.

THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE REQUIRED PURSUANT WAC 173-27-040(1):

- 1. All work shall substantially conform to the specifications of the JARPA application packet submitted to Kittitas County Community Development Services by Mark Cook on October 4, 2018.
- 2. Issuance of this shoreline exemption permit does not authorize access onto private property, or waive other jurisdictional agency requirements. The permittee shall obtain consent from respective property owner(s) prior to entering onto private property, and shall obtain and comply with all applicable federal and state permit requirements in completing the proposed development.
- 3. Issuance of this shoreline exemption will not create liability on the part of Kittitas County or any officer or employee thereof, for any on or off site injury or damages that may result from this project.
- 4. This project is subject to KCC 17A Critical Areas, KCC 17B Shorelines, and all other applicable city, county, state and/or federal regulations.

CONSISTENCY ANALYSIS

A shoreline substantial development permit is not required for the project as described due to exemption WAC 173-27-040(2)(b) and (e). Although exempted by statute/rule, such exempt developments must comply with all other regulatory requirements of the Shoreline Management Act and Kittitas County Shoreline Master Program.

- The Development will comply with the Washington State Water Code (See Revised Code of Washington 90.03).
- Buffer strips of permanent vegetation between shoreline development and associated water bodies are encouraged, and private and public land owners shall be responsible for the preservation of vegetation to minimize erosion within the shoreline areas (See KCSMP 5.3A(5)).
- Nothing in these regulations shall obviate any requirement to obtain any permit, certificate, license, or approval from any state agency or local government (See Revised Code of Washington 90.58.360).

Note: This application is exempt from SEPA per WAC 197-11-800(3): "The following activities shall be categorically exempt: The repair, remodeling, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing private or public structures, facilities or equipment, including utilities, recreation, and transportation facilities involving no material expansions or changes in use beyond that previously existing; except that, where undertaken wholly or in part on lands covered by water, only minor repair or replacement of structures may be exempt (examples include repair or replacement of piling, ramps, floats, or mooring buoys, or minor repair, alteration, or maintenance of docks). The following maintenance activities shall not be considered exempt under this subsection:

- (a) Dredging of over fifty cubic yards of material;
- (b) Reconstruction or maintenance of groins and similar shoreline protection structures;
- (c) Replacement of utility cables that must be buried under the surface of the bedlands; or
- (d) Repair/rebuilding of major dams, dikes, and reservoirs shall also not be considered exempt under this subsection."

In addition, the project is exempt under WAC 197-11-880 as an "action must be undertaken immediately or within a time too short to allow full compliance with this chapter, to avoid an imminent threat to public health or safety, to prevent an imminent danger to public or private property, or to prevent an imminent threat of serious environmental degradation. The project "shall be exempt."


