Chelsea, I left you a message to call me, but you could also e-mail. Your letter that the "plans submitted are very small" was exactly right, but I have commonly encountered troubles with larger plans. All my designs are done 11x17 size, and some clients don't have 11x17 copy capability, plus "everyone" (except old people like me) seem to prefer electronic versions of everything, namely scanned PDF's. So this is what I gave

Thayers to submit, those reduced size plans that could be scanned PDF along with the 8.5x11 permit application pages.

So my questions to you:

1. Are 11x17 copies okay for the permit application drawings? I no longer design to 22x34 inch size, because these over-sized drawings cannot be copied with normal copy machines.

2. The overall site plan is drawn at scale 1"=100' to fit on one 11x17 sheet. I needed to show the existing road all the way to where I could point towards Barnes Road (to make sense of entire proposal). You listed 1"=50' scale minimum. Should I separate this 1"=100' scale drawing into two 1"=50' scale drawings with a "Match Line" for you to combine the drawings for review?

3. Let me know about the above questions. Then, how many copies 11x17 should I send by mail? All the scales would be accurate 1:1 (instead of reduced PDF versions) and I assume the County can copy 11x17's.
