Open Table



***SNAP/Basic Food**

Basic Food is Washington State's Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), formerly known as food stamps. Benefits can be used at all local grocery stores, farmers markets, and participating produce stands and convenience stores. Apply by making a free call to 2-1-1, through the Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS) in person at 1100 West University Way in Ellensburg, Monday through Friday 8:00 to 5:00, or online at www.washingtonconnection.org.

*Women, Infants, and Children Program (WIC)

WIC provides checks for healthy food, health screenings, nutrition education, breastfeeding support, and community resources to income eligible pregnant women, a caregiver, or a mom with a child under 5 years old.
