Kittitas County Jail Annual PREA (Prison Rape Elimination Act) Report

This report contains data for 2020 of all inmates booked and/or housed in the Kittitas County Jail (KCJ) located in Ellensburg, WA under the direction of the Kittitas County Sheriff's Office. The Kittitas County Jail is a 209-bed facility. The jail houses adult male and female inmates. This report includes incidents involving inmates under the authority, custody, or care including those held in separate holding or lockup areas within the facility. Excluded from this report are those inmates held in other jurisdictions.

Section 2- INMATE-ON-INMATE SEXUAL VICTIMIZATION

DEFINITIONS

The survey utilizes the definition of "sexual abuse" as provided by 28 C.F.R § 115.6 in the National Standards to Prevent, Detect, and respond to Prison Rape (under the Prison Rape Elimination Act of 2003). Attempted nonconsensual sexual acts are included if recorded by the facility. For purposes of SSV, sexual abuse is disaggregated into three categories of inmate-on-inmate sexual victimization. These categories are:

NONCONSENSUAL SEXUAL ACTS

Sexual conduct of any person without his or her consent, or of a person who is unable to consent or refuse;

AND

 Contact between the penis and the vulva or the penis and the anus including penetration, however slight;

OR

Contact between the mouth and the penis, vulva, or anus

OR

• Penetration of the anal or genital opening of another person, however slight, by a hand, finger, object, or other instrument

ABUSIVE SEXUAL CONTACT

Sexual contact of any person without his or her consent, or of a person who is unable to consent or refuse;

AND

- Intentional touching, either directly or through the clothing, of the genitalia, anus, groin, breast, inner thigh, or buttocks of any person.
- EXCLUDE incidents in which the contact was incidental to physical altercation

SEXUAL HARASSMENT

Repeated and unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, or verbal comments, gestures, or actions of a derogatory or offensive sexual nature by one inmate directed toward another
