Pioneer Coffee & The Library do not accept Lead Acid Batteries

Batteries must be separated into 2 categories:

- **Terminal Protected** (Any Coin, Rechargeable, Lithium, or 9 Volt)
- **Unprotected** (Alkaline)

Terminal protection can be achieved by individually placing each battery in a clear bag or by placing clear packing tape over the positive (+) terminal

Lead Acid (Pb) batteries from cars, tractors, four wheelers, and motorbikes. Lead Acid batteries can be recycled at the Cle Elum Transfer Station and by the Kittitas County Solid Waste Office. Please place batteries on pallet outside by the used oil tanks.
