Our program really hit the ground running within this quarter. We made our first two matches at the beginning of January, and the pairs have been meeting almost every week since then. THRIVE team met with our MENTOR Affiliate for technical assistance in February and we were told that our program is safe and following policies and procedures to fidelity. In February, the EHS tabling event was a huge success and one of our team members connected and engaged with students. Our first quarterly event was held in March, and was also a huge success with 5 out of 7 of our mentors in attendance.	THRIVE made huge strides this quarter. We hired 3 new mentors and provided training for 4 total mentors. This quarter 7 new matches were made. We met with 5 new mentees. We are excited about our new partnership with DCYF after presenting to their team. Our second quarterly event was a huge success, we were able to connect with community members, talk about our program and meet 20 new youth.

We are actively recruiting specifically male mentors through word of mouth and our monthly newsletter.	Scheduling initial meet and greets with guardians remains a challenge for our program. An additional challenge this quarter has been scheduling mentor/mentee meet ups with our older youth, to address this we continue to provide regular check ins with both our mentors and mentees to problem solve and use our MENTOR affiliate for technical assistance when needed.
