REQUEST FOR STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS

HYDROLOGY AND HYDRAULIC MODELING SERVICES CREATING A TWO DIMENSIONAL FLOW MODEL FOR CRYSTAL CREEK IN KITTITAS COUNTY, WA

All submittals received after 10:00 a.m. Local Time on August 22, 2019 will be discarded.

PURPOSE:

Kittitas County desires creating a two-dimensional flow model utilizing current regulatory mapping requirements for re-mapping regulatory floodplain along Crystal Creek in Kittitas County. The model will encompass approximately five miles of FEMA approximate mapping standard and 4.5 miles of FEMA detailed standard.

SCOPE OF PROJECT SUMMARY:

CONSULTANT will integrate Kittitas County survey information and other data creating the modeling surface for the compliant FEMA two-dimensional flow model. The model will incorporate the most recent available LiDAR data set(s) and any supplement information provided by the County. The CONSULTANT will provide draft and final regulatory flood maps and submit the final maps to FEMA for technical review. CONSULTANT will support review of the final maps by FEMA contractors through FEMA acceptance.

PROCEDURES FOR SUBMITTAL:

If you wish to be considered for work under this SOQ, you must be a registered consultant on the Municipal Research and Service Center of Washington - Shared Small Works and Consultant Roster (www.mrscroster.org).

If interested in providing FEMA floodplain modeling services for Crystal Creek in Kittitas County, submit a sealed envelope to Mark R. Cook, Kittitas County Public Works Director at 411 N. Ruby St. Suite 1, Ellensburg WA 98926. Submittals shall include a one page cover letter with the firm name as listed on the MRSC web site, and contact information. Submittals shall also include four copies of your Statement of Qualifications describing the firm's or team's ability to professionally provide the aforementioned services.

For your records, the County will provide a confirmation email to the contacts provided in the submittal confirming receipt of your interest in the proposal. Submittals received after August 22, 2019 at 10:00 AM Local Time will be disregarded.

The County may elect to interview firms prior to awarding the modeling contract. Kittitas County encourages disadvantaged, minority and women owned consultant firms to respond.

The County reserves the right to reject any and all submittals.

SELECTION PROCESS AND PROPOSED SCHEDULE:

Kittitas County selection will be based on the following review of submitted materials:

- 1. The firm's or team's qualifications, experience and ability to perform the work (20 points);
- 2. Demonstrated experience with similar projects in Kittitas County within the past ten years (30 points);
- 3. Demonstrated experience integrating CONSULTANT efforts with agency staff producing model hydraulics (30 points);
- Demonstrated ability to keep projects on time and within budget specifically delivering approximate and detailed two-dimensional flow models to FEMA contractor model reviewers (20 points);
- 5. Demonstrated ability to communicate and work effectively with the public, other consultants, staff, policy and review bodies and regulatory agencies (20 points).

Responders are encouraged to pay attention to the point allocation listed above as this forms the basis for responder selection.

Consultants will be selected on the basis of their qualifications and experience, with fees determined through negotiations following selection. The qualifications of consultants are evaluated and the best qualified consultant is selected, subject to a mutual understanding of the scope of services and negotiation of a fair and reasonable fee.
