

## REQUEST FOR STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS

For Consulting Services Relating to Professional Civil, Structural, Electrical, and Construction Engineering Services

All submittals received after 10:00 AM Thursday, April 9<sup>th</sup>, 2026, will be discarded

### PURPOSE:

Kittitas County is requesting Statement of Qualifications (SOQ) from qualified professionals for on-call consulting services relating to Civil, Structural, Construction Engineering services, and Electrical Engineering Services. The consultant(s) will provide a variety of on-call services to the County as projects are budgeted for development. The on-call contract will be for three years (3) with an opportunity for one one-year extension if mutually agreed upon and approval is obtained by the Board of County Commissioners

The County provides no guarantee that any projects will become available. However, as projects develop the County may need the services of a consultant with expertise in the following areas:

- Civil Engineering and Design Services
- Structural Engineering Design and Inspection Services
- Environmental Design Services
- Construction Management
- Project Scheduling
- Outreach and public involvement activities
- Electrical Engineering Services

All such services and projects will include compliance with potential ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) criteria in addition to all other regulatory compliance.

### SCOPE OF PROJECT:

#### 1. Civil Engineering Services

The consultant must be able to provide engineers, drafters, and other related support and professional staff for on-call consulting to Kittitas County. These services may include but are not limited to, survey data collection and preparation of project designs including roads, retaining walls, safety elements, hydraulics, soils and paving, and other transportation/solid waste facilities and features.

The consultant must demonstrate competence and qualifications related to the services performed including:

- A. Successful experience in detailed designs from the preliminary design through final construction documents.

- B. The consultant must have extensive experience with the Department of Ecology and the Washington State Department of Transportation publications, standards, design and documentation procedures.
- C. The consultant must possess strong knowledge in local government contracting procedures, and engineering guidelines such as local codes, and AASHTO engineering publications.
- D. Demonstrate the knowledge and ability to identify design and constructability conflicts prior to final design and facilitate review processes to avoid preventable design errors.
- E. Successful experience delivering projects in a streamlined fashion to reduce scope schedule and budget.
- F. The consultant must demonstrate the ability to manage projects and coordinate with other design team members, utility departments, and Kittitas County staff, to ensure the projects are delivered on time and within budget, with potential risks and opportunities identified.
- G. The consultant must assist in the preparation of addendums, review of shop drawings and submittals support the bid and award process and prepare final as-built records.
- H. Ability to respond to unexpected as well as regularly scheduled requests for services with minimal delay.
- I. Ability to work collaboratively in a regulatory environment with other agencies, interest groups, and permit applicants.
- J. Ability to support and collect various survey needs including survey control establishment, topographic collection, construction staking, and monumentation work.

## 2. Structural Engineering Services

The consultant must be able to provide engineers, drafters, inspectors, and other related support and professional staff for on-call consulting to Kittitas County. These services may include but are not limited to preparing structural and remodel designs.

The consultant must demonstrate competence and qualifications related to the services performed including:

- A. Successful experience in detailed designs from the preliminary design through final construction documents.
- C. The consultant must possess strong knowledge in local government contracting procedures, and engineering guidelines such as local codes, and AASHTO engineering publications.

- D. Demonstrate the knowledge and ability to identify design and constructability conflicts prior to final design and facilitate review processes to avoid preventable design errors.
- E. Successful experience delivering projects in a streamlined fashion to reduce scope schedule and budget.
- F. The consultant must demonstrate the ability to manage projects and coordinate with other design team members, utility departments, and Kittitas County staff, to ensure the projects are delivered on time and within budget, with potential risks and opportunities identified.
- G. Ability to respond to unexpected as well as regularly scheduled requests for services with minimal delay.

### 3. Construction Engineering Services

The consultant must be able to provide engineers, inspectors, and other related support and professional staff for on-call consulting to Kittitas County. These services may include but are not limited to, inspecting the construction of roads, structural features, retaining walls, safety elements, hydraulic projects, soils and paving, and other transportation facilities and features.

The consultant must demonstrate competence and qualifications related to the services performed including:

- A. The consultant must have extensive experience with the Federal Highway Administration and the Washington State Department of Transportation publications, standards, inspection and documentation procedures.
- B. The consultant must possess strong knowledge in local government contracting procedures, and engineering guidelines such as local codes, and AASHTO engineering publications.
- C. Demonstrate the knowledge and ability to inspect construction activities for compliance with the plans and specification packages, and track materials, pay items, and daily work all while documenting it per State and Federal requirements.
- D. The consultant must demonstrate the ability to manage construction projects and coordinate with other team members, utility departments, and Kittitas County staff, to ensure the projects are delivered on time and within budget, with potential risks and opportunities identified.
- E. Ability to respond to unexpected as well as regularly scheduled requests for services with minimal delay.

F. Ability to work collaboratively in a regulatory environment with other agencies, interest groups, and permit applicants.

#### 4. Electrical Engineering Services

The consultant must be able to provide engineers, inspectors, and other related support and professional staff for on-call consulting to Kittitas County. These services may include but are not limited to electrical experience within correctional facilities, designing, developing, implementing, emergency power systems, and testing of electrical equipment.

The consultant must demonstrate competence and qualifications related to the services performed including:

A. The consultant must possess strong knowledge of local government contracting procedures, and engineering guidelines such as local and state codes.

B. Demonstrate the knowledge and ability to inspect construction activities for compliance with the plans and specification packages, and track materials, pay items, and daily work all while documenting it per State and Federal requirements.

C. The consultant must demonstrate the ability to manage construction projects and coordinate with other team members, utility departments, and Kittitas County staff, to ensure the projects are delivered on time and within budget, with potential risks and opportunities identified.

D. Ability to respond to unexpected as well as regularly scheduled requests for services with minimal delay.

E. Ability to work collaboratively in a regulatory environment with other agencies, interest groups, and permit applicants.

## **PROCEDURES FOR SUBMITTAL:**

If you wish to be considered for on-call work under this SOQ, you must be a registered consultant on the Municipal Research and Service Center of Washington – Shared Small Works and Consultant Roster ([www.mrscroster.org](http://www.mrscroster.org)).

If interested in providing on-call services to the County, submit a sealed envelope to Cody Cupp, Kittitas County Assistant Maintenance Director, at, 205 W 5<sup>th</sup> ave Suite 108, Ellensburg WA 98926 by 10:00 am on April 9, 2026, indicating your interest and which services, or any combination thereof which you would like to be considered for.

Submittals shall include a one-page cover letter with the firm name as listed on the MRSC web site, contact information, and list of which services you'd like to provide. Submittals shall also include three copies of your Statement of Qualifications describing the firm's or team's ability to professionally provide the aforementioned services.

For your records, the County will provide a confirmation email to the contacts provided in the submittal confirming receipt of your interest in the proposal. Submittals received after 10:00 AM on April 9th, 2026 will be disregarded.

Kittitas County will build an internal interview committee, invite three firms to interview for the on-call services as listed in this SOQ, and then provide for firm selections. Kittitas County encourages disadvantaged, minority and women owned consultant firms to respond.

The County reserves the right to reject any and all submittals.

## **SELECTION PROCESS AND PROPOSED SCHEDULE:**

Kittitas County selection will be based upon:

1. The firm's or team's qualifications, experience and ability to perform the work;
2. Demonstrated experience with similar projects;
3. Ability to apply creative solutions to complicated projects;
4. Demonstrated ability to keep projects on time and within budget;
5. Demonstrated ability to communicate and work effectively with the public, staff, policy and review bodies;
6. The firm's ability to scale the work and allocate appropriate resources resulting in the most efficient use of County funds.

7. Responsiveness to this request for qualifications.

The selected consultant(s) will be expected to enter into a standard Kittitas County Professional Services Agreement. Insurance requirements are included in that agreement. The contract period shall be for on-call services for up to four (4) years.

Kittitas County reserves the right to accept or reject any and all proposals or any items or part thereof or to waive any information or irregularities in the proposals. Kittitas County shall have the sole discretion to determine the most responsible proposal.
