ABOUT THE AUDIT

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of Kittitas County from January 1, 2009 through December 31, 2009.

We evaluated internal controls and performed audit procedures on the activities of the County. We also determined whether the County complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of noncompliance, misappropriation or misuse. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Cost allocation to utility funds
- Contracts and agreements/change orders
- County Fair
- Sheriff's Office
- Donated assets

- Solid waste bank reconciliations
- Ethics/conflict of interest laws
- Purchases and payments
- Payroll
- Restricted revenue Real Estate Excise Tax funds

RESULTS

In most areas, the County complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures.
