



State Environmental Policy Act PRELIMINARY MITIGATED DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE

Description: Vic Jansen is proposing the construction of a 4.5 mile road system and the installation of an irrigation system with services to the lots for a subdivision which would be accessed via Hunter Road. The project is proposed on a site that is zoned Agriculture 20 & Commercial Agriculture. The proposal is classified under Kittitas County Code (KCC) 17.15.060.1 as “single-family dwelling.” As defined in the allowable uses table, this is a permitted use in the existing zone and land use designation.

Location: The subject properties are parcel #'s 046433, 046433, 056433, 066433, 076433, 21465, 21466, 21467, 21468, 21469, 21470, 21471, 21472, 21473, 21474, 21475, 21476, 21477, 21478, 21479, 21480, 21481, 21482, 21483, 21484, 21485, 21486, 21487, 21488, 21489, 21490, 21491, 21492, 21493, 21494, 21495, 21496, 21497, 21498, 21499, 21500, 21501, 21502, 21503, 21504, 21505, 21506, 21508, 21509, 21510, 086433, 21512, 21513, 21514, 21515, 21516, 21517, 21518, 21519, 21520, 21521, 21522, 21523, 21524, 21525, 21526, and located approximately 1.75 miles west of the intersection of Killmore Road & Hunter Road west of Ellensburg, WA. in Section 22, Township 18, Range 17, in Kittitas County.

Lead Agency: Kittitas County Community Development Services

The lead agency for this proposal has determined that the proposal will not have a probable significant adverse impact on the environment. An Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) is not required under RCW 43.21C.030 (2) (c) and WAC 197-11. This decision was made after review of a SEPA environmental checklist and other information on file with the lead agency, after considering voluntary mitigation measures which the lead agency or the applicant will implement as part of the proposal, and after considering mitigation measures required by existing laws and regulations that will be implemented by the applicant as part of the Kittitas County permit process. The responsible official finds this information reasonably sufficient to evaluate the environmental impact of this proposal. The lead agency has determined that certain mitigation measures are necessary in order to issue a Mitigated Determination of Non-Significance (MDNS) for this proposal. Prior to issuing the MDNS, a

preliminary MDNS will be sent out with the Notice of Application. The mitigation measures include the following:

Earth

- 1) A fill and grade permit is required pursuant to Kittitas County Code 14.05.050

Transportation

- 1) The applicant shall adhere to all applicable regulations as set forth in the current Kittitas County Road Standards.
- 2) The access locations shall be reviewed by the Kittitas County Department of Public Works to ensure that the access locations meet all applicable criteria for ingress/egress.

Stormwater

- 1) A Stormwater Plan prepared by a State of Washington licensed engineer, and approved by the Kittitas County Public Works Department is required prior to issuance of any building permit.
- 2) The project shall have temporary erosion and sediment control measures implemented during construction.
- 3) The applicant shall work with the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife on Hydraulic Project Approval (HPA).

Cultural Resources and Historic Preservation

- 1) A Cultural Resources Survey shall be conducted prior to any ground disturbing activities and survey results shall be submitted to DAHP and associated tribes.
- 2) Should ground disturbing or other activities related to the proposed plat result in the inadvertent discovery of cultural or archaeological materials, work shall be stopped in the immediate area and contact be made with the Washington State DAHP. Work shall remain suspended until the find is assessed and appropriate consultation is conducted. Should human remains be inadvertently discovered, as dictated by Washington State RCW 27.44.055, work shall be immediately halted in the area and contact made with the coroner and local law enforcement in the most expeditious manner possible.

Noise

- 1) Development and construction practices during construction of this project shall only occur between the hours of 7:00 am to 7:00 pm to minimize the effect of construction noise on nearby properties.

Air

- 1) A dust control plan shall be developed and implemented during construction of the project.
- 2) During construction, reduction of construction caused dust and airborne contaminants shall be reduced through the use of water or other Department of Ecology approved methods.

Plants & Animals

- 1) The applicant shall identify the priority habitat and species found on the project site, as outlined by Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW).
- 2) The applicant shall work with the (WDFW) to develop a hazard mitigation plan for the Fish & Wildlife Habitat Conservation Areas (FWHCA) found on the project site.

The County expects to issue a Mitigated Determination of Non-Significance (MDNS) for this proposal, and will use the optional MDNS process authorized by WAC 197-11-355, meaning this may be the only opportunity for the public to comment on the environmental impacts of the proposal. Comments on this proposal can be submitted to CDS any time prior to 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, April 18, 2024.
