In that time we have had the Boys Home, hundreds of Turbines and managed to defeat PacificClean on the Medical Waste from the Westside. We have a Silage Pit that originally was the Brown Brothers hauling scraps from Twin City Foods, there was a lot of liquid in it and it eventually leaked down and into our pond. You should be able to check with the DOE in Yakima.

I am wondering why we have received such a short period of time to respond (Aug 17 to Sept 1). There are so many things to consider about this, many of them have to do with our health. Water quality, Parke Creek runs near it and the Canal also runs near it. I am sure you have thought about the fact that much of this runs back into the rivers. There is also our personal water supply if it is affected and our water goes bad it will be too late for us. The Silage Pit showed us that leakage is possible. It is about 5 miles from us and flowed down and ended up in our pond. Air Quality wind is going to carry the smell, contaminated airborne particles and other garbage to the surrounding area.

I hope you will deny this application and Leave it where it is already at. There are few neighbors in that area to be affected
