Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the SE-21-00018 Anderson Hay application concerning the grading and clearing of an area off Umptanum Road. Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) has reviewed the application and supporting documents. Our comments are regarding the project's impact on priority fish and wildlife habitats, particularly shrubsteppe habitat.

The project area contains both shrubsteppe habitat and the area is also mapped Mule Deer Winter Range, both are critical areas under Kittitas County Critical Areas Ordinance. To ensure no loss of these habitats, WDFW requests compensatory mitigation, for any additional clearing of shrubsteppe habitat as part of the project and restoring the project area to shrubsteppe habitat once the project has been completed and the material is removed. To accomplish that, a mitigation and restoration plan should be prepared in consultation with WDFW as a condition of approval. To further understand clearing limits, potential for mitigation and restoration, WDFW requests a site visit with WDFW with the applicant and the county.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the Pre-Threshold Consultation for the Anderson Hay Grading and Excavating Project. We have reviewed the environmental checklist and have the following comment.

#### WATER QUALITY

#### Project with Potential to Discharge Off-Site

The NPDES Construction Stormwater General Permit from the Washington State Department of Ecology is required if there is a potential for stormwater discharge from a construction site with disturbed ground. This permit requires that the SEPA checklist fully disclose anticipated activities including building, road construction and utility placements. Obtaining a permit may take 38-60 days.

The permit requires that a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (Erosion Sediment Control Plan) shall be prepared and implemented for all permitted construction sites. These control measures must be able to prevent soil from being carried into surface water and storm drains by stormwater runoff. Permit coverage and erosion control measures must be in place prior to any clearing, grading, or construction.

Erosion control measures must be in place prior to any clearing, grading, or construction. These control measures must prevent soil from being carried by stormwater runoff into surface waters,

or into stormwater drains that may discharge directly to surface water. Sand, silt, and soil will damage aquatic habitat and are considered pollutants.

I have reviewed the SEPA Checklist and associated documents for the listed project and/or construction for Kittitas County Fire District 2. The Fire District has no code enforcement authority so my input is, from a fire department response and operation basis.

#### Comments:

- Fire apparatus access roads exceeding 150' shall be provided with a temporary or permanent turnaround meeting the requirement 2018 IFC Appendix D.
- Fire apparatus access roads shall not exceed 10% in grade. This is especially critical in our valley's climate. Based on the provided information there are portions of the proposed road that exceed 10%.
- The IFC requires the road be capable of supporting an imposed load of at least 75,000 lbs.
- Our standard turning radius is a minimum of 23' inside and 45' outside.
