I wish to enter a comment in regards to Flood Control (SE-22-00053) and wondering if this email is sufficient, or do you need a printed copy delivered?

I attach an elevation profile (KittitasCounty DraftPlans.pdf) that we received from Kittitas County a couple years ago, after we met with County engineers at this site. My concern is that the existing (unpermitted) adjacent road is consistently at a higher elevation than the proposed drainage ditch, which will make most of the work by Kittitas County a complete waste of time. Flood waters cannot reach the proposed improvements due to the impervious surface labelled "Existing Road" on attached document.

I request details of the County plan, showing how flood waters can ever even reach the proposed improvements. Most likely that would require installation of culverts under the "Existing Road" which crosses State Park property.
