The Snoqualmie Tribe [Tribe] is a federally recognized sovereign Indian Tribe. We were signatory to the Treaty of Point Elliott of 1855; we reserved certain rights and privileges and ceded certain lands to the United States. As a signatory to the Treaty of Point Elliot, the Tribe specifically reserved among other things, the right to fish at usual and accustomed areas and the "privilege of hunting and gathering roots and berries on open and unclaimed lands" off-reservation throughout the modern-day state of Washington.

Thank you for the opportunity to review and comment. Based on the information provided and our understanding of the project and its APE, we recommend an archeological review performed for this project. This is in an area the Snoqualmie Tribe considers culturally significant and has a moderate probability to have unknown archaeological deposits. We realize that the current request will not cause ground disturbance, in this cases the process leads to development projects that will. If any archaeological work is performed, we request notification. An IDP should not be used in lieu of an archeological investigation. Cultural and archaeological resources are non-renewable and are best discovered prior to ground disturbance.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment during the Optional Determination of Non Significance process for the Owens Access Road. We have reviewed the documents and have the following comments.

WATER RESOURCES

Groundwater Exempt Uses

In Washington State, prospective water users must obtain authorization from the Department of Ecology before diverting surface water or withdrawing ground water, with one exception. Ground water withdrawals of up to 5,000 gallons per day used for single or group domestic supply, up to 5,000 gallons per day used for industrial purposes, stock watering, and for the irrigation of up to one-half acre of non-commercial lawn and garden are exempt from the permitting process. Water use under the RCW 90.44.050 exemption establishes a water right that is subject to the same privileges, restrictions, laws and regulations as a water right permit or certificate obtained directly from Ecology.

Thank you for contacting the Washington State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) and Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP) and providing documentation regarding the above referenced project. These comments are based on the information available at the time of this review and on behalf of the SHPO in conformance Washington State law. Should additional information become available, our assessment may be revised.

Our statewide predictive model indicates that there is a moderate probability of encountering cultural resources within the proposed project area. However, the presence of talus slopes within the project area suggests that culturally significant talus features may be present. Further, the scale of the proposed ground disturbing actions would destroy any archaeological resources present. Identification during construction is not a recommended detection method because inadvertent discoveries often result in costly construction delays and damage to the resource. Therefore, we recommend a professional archaeological survey of the project area be conducted and a report be produced prior to ground disturbing activities. This report should meet DAHP's <u>Standards for Cultural Resource Reporting</u>.

We also recommend that any historic buildings or structures (45 years in age or older) located within the project area are evaluated for eligibility for listing in the National Register of Historic Places on Historic Property Inventory (HPI) forms. We highly encourage the SEPA lead agency to ensure that these evaluations are written by a cultural resource professional meeting the <u>SOI</u> <u>Professional Qualification Standards in Architectural History</u>.

Please note that the recommendations provided in this letter reflect only the opinions of DAHP. Any interested Tribes may have different recommendations. We appreciate receiving any correspondence or comments from Tribes or other parties concerning cultural resource issues that you receive.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the proposed project to build an access road near Bettas Road. The Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) has reviewed the application materials and has the following comments for consideration to ensure adequate protection of all Fish and Wildlife Habitat Conservation Areas.

The four parcels within the project area contain shrubsteppe habitat and provide important habitat for mule deer and elk as well as several other birds and reptiles. WDFW's online Priority Habitats and Species (PHS) map has accurately mapped portions of the project area as shrubsteppe habitat, as mule deer winter range habitat, and as a biodiversity area and migration corridor. More information about the PHS species and habitats can be found at this <u>website</u>.

While we appreciate that actions are proposed to minimize impacts, the project as currently proposed will result in a net loss of shrubsteppe habitat and its associated species. The road and subsequent development may also impact migration of animals through this corridor. WDFW recommends mitigation for these impacts. WDFW would welcome the opportunity to meet on site to begin conversations on how best to achieve this mitigation.
