MITIGATED DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE

Description: Two Tall Trees, LLC. is proposing to construct a new single family residence and future plans for

a detached garage, which requires a Class IV Forest Practices Act permit per the Department of Natural Resources. The subject parcel is located in the Rural 5 zoning and Rural Residential

Land Use.

The lead agency for this proposal has determined that it will not have a probable significant adverse impact on the environment. An environmental impact statement (EIS) is not required under RCW 43.21C.030(2)(c). This decision was made after review of a completed environmental checklist and other information on file with the lead agency. This information is available to the public on request, or can be viewed at the Kittitas County Community Development Services website at: http://www.co.kittitas.wa.us/cds/land-use/default.aspx under "Miscellaneous SEPA Applications" and project file number "SE-22-00063 Stiefel"

The lead agency has determined that certain mitigation measures are necessary in order to issue a Mitigated Determination of Non-Significance (MDNS) for this proposal. Failure to comply with mitigation measures identified hereafter will result in the issuance of a Determination of Significance (DS) for this project. The mitigation measures include the following:

Critical Areas

- 1) Any grading over 100 cubic yards of material requires a grading permit through Kittitas County Public Works. Any grading over 500 cubic yards of material will require engineered grading and storm water plans. See Kittitas County Code chapter 14.05. The applicant shall not grade until their grading permit is issued.
- 2) The applicant shall work with Department of Ecology to ensure all required State permitting is obtained.

Cultural Resources

3) Should ground disturbing or other activities related to the grading and clearing result in the inadvertent discovery of cultural or archaeological materials, work shall be stopped in the immediate area and contact be made with the Washington State Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation

(DAHP). Work shall remain suspended until the find is assessed and appropriate consultation is conducted. Should human remains be inadvertently discovered, as dictated by Washington State RCW 27.44.055, work shall be immediately halted in the area and contact made with the coroner and local law enforcement in the most expeditious manner possible.

This MDNS is issued under WAC 197-11-355; the lead agency will not act on this proposal for 10 working days. Any action to set aside, enjoin, review, or otherwise challenge this administrative SEPA action on the grounds of noncompliance with the provisions of Chapter 43.21 RCW, shall be commenced on or before **November 10, 2022 at 5 pm.**
