This consult is in reference to Miscellaneous SEPA Applications SE-23-00016 Ritter. Ground disturbing activities include the grading and construction of a road, the SEPA document

This undertaking is located within the CCT Traditional Territories. We request any undertakings, particularly those involving ground disturbing activities, to have an IDP in place prior to implementation.

The proposed project lies within the traditional territory of the Moses-Columbia Tribe, 1 of the 12 constituent tribes of the Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation (CTCR), which is governed by the Colville Business Council (CBC). The CBC has delegated to the Tribal Historic Preservation Officer (THPO) the responsibility of representing the CTCR with regard to cultural resources management issues throughout the traditional territories of all of the constituent tribes under Resolution 1996-29. This area includes parts of eastern Washington, northeastern Oregon, the Palus territory in Idaho, and south-central British Columbia.

If ground disturbing activities are to be conducted, such as the installation of a septic system or the scraping of a roadway, a cultural resource surface survey and sub-surface testing of the area in and directly around the proposed ground disturbance are recommended as a surface observation will not be an accurate assessment of the existent potential for subsurface cultural deposits. This test should be to the terminal depth of the septic installation to ensure the totality of the presence or absence of cultural material.

There are no known cultural resources of significance nearby and this particular plat is considered Very High Risk for an inadvertent discovery according to the DAHP predictive model. This parcel has not been previously surveyed and a preliminary archaeological investigation would be prudent. There was a survey from 2006 for the construction of the Bar 14 bridge that is in the section but the size, scope, and age of this previous survey is inadequate to assess the impacts of this implementation on cultural resources.

CCT requests a cultural resource survey prior to the implementation of ground disturbing activities and that during implementation that there be an inadvertent discovery plan or (IDP) in place to ensure compliance with all Section 106 and relevant cultural resource laws both federally and to the state of Washington.

Thank you for consulting with the Colville Confederated Tribes History and Archaeology Program.

Shorelands and Environmental Assistance

Regarding Wetland and Potential Wetland Impacts

Text in the SEPA Checklist indicate a wetland report is pending. The report should delineate any wetlands using the US Army Corps of Engineers Wetland Rating Manual (1987) and the Regional Supplement for the Arid West. Any wetlands should be rated following guidelines in the Washington State Wetland Rating System for Eastern Washington: 2014 Update. The wetland report should provide all information required in Kittitas County Code 17A.07 WETLANDS including mitigation planning for any potential impacts to wetlands or wetland buffers. Water Quality

Erosion control measures must be in place prior to any clearing, grading, or construction. These control measures must prevent soil from being carried by stormwater runoff into surface waters, or into stormwater drains that may discharge directly to surface water. The Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) is familiar with this area and habitat as the property is located between Mercer Creek to the west and Wilson Creek to the east. There are several potential critical areas near the project area and we look forward to reviewing the critical areas report referenced in the SEPA checklist.

This project area is within the alluvial fan of the Wilson-Naneum Watershed. The Kittitas Reclamation District (KRD) canal north of the project area passes Mercer Creek and Wilson Creek through their canal and the KRD delivers irrigation water to this project area. During flood events, it is possible that all natural stream channels and irrigation delivery ditches will be conveying flood water. The design of the access road, berms and culverts may interrupt these flows and change the distribution of water during high and/or low flow conditions on this property and potentially other nearby parcels.

We encourage further review of how the road, as proposed, may impact critical areas such as frequently flooded areas and wetlands.

Thank you for contacting the Washington State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) and Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP) and providing documentation regarding the above referenced project. These comments are based on the information available at the time of this review and on behalf of the SHPO in conformance Washington State law. Should additional information become available, our assessment may be revised.

Our statewide predictive model indicates that there is a high probability of encountering cultural resources within the proposed project area. This is due, in part, to the presence of multiple sources of fresh water near the proposed project area. Further, the scale of the proposed ground disturbing actions would destroy any archaeological resources present. Identification during construction is not a recommended detection method because inadvertent discoveries often result in costly construction delays and damage to the resource. Therefore, we recommend a professional archaeological survey of the project area be conducted and a report be produced prior to ground disturbing activities. This report should meet DAHP's <u>Standards for Cultural Resource Reporting</u>.

We also recommend that any historic buildings or structures (45 years in age or older) located within the project area are evaluated for eligibility for listing in the National Register of Historic Places on Historic Property Inventory (HPI) forms. We highly encourage the SEPA lead agency to ensure that these evaluations are written by a cultural resource professional meeting the SOI Professional Qualification Standards in Architectural History.

Please note that the recommendations provided in this letter reflect only the opinions of DAHP. Any interested Tribes may have different recommendations. We appreciate receiving any correspondence or comments from Tribes or other parties concerning cultural resource issues that you receive.
