Hi Dusty,

I was hoping to see the plans before we sent back a reply.

That said, the concern that the Forest Service has with setbacks that could lead to development encroaching onto Forest Service land. The Forest Service doesn't comment on how private land is utilized or County setbacks; but we typically do not favor changes in setbacks that could inadvertently put private improvements near or on FS land. That is why we requested to see the plans to verify where improvement would be made on that land. It's common in situations where private developments are near Forest boundaries that improvements will slop over; this could be as small as a woodpile or as large as a dwelling structure.
