NOTICE IS HEREBY given that Phillip Heidt, landowner, and Devin Casto, Authorized Agent, submitted a Setback Variance application on February 24, 2022 pursuant to Kittitas County Code 17.84 on 3.03 acres of land zoned Rural 5 in a Rural Residential Land Use. The proposal requests a 15-foot reduction from the 25-foot front lot line setback for the northern most property line for the construction of a house and a 20-foot reduction from the 25-foot front lot line setback from the southwestern property line for construction of a garage. The 25-foot front setback requirements come from KCC 17.30A.050. If the variance is approved, it would result in a 10-foot front lot line structural setback from the northern most property line and a 5-foot front lot line setback from the southwestern lot line. The current appeal fee is \$1550, however you are encouraged to verify fee prior to filing of an appeal.
