Permitted use as defined by the FAA	Compliant	Non-Compliant
1. Storing active aircraft; sheltering aircraft for maintenance, repair,		
or refurbishment, but not indefinitely storing non-operational		
aircraft; constructing amateur-built or kit-built aircraft provided that		
activities are conducted safely. There shall be room for the aircraft		
in the aircraft hangar for the based aircraft at all times, even when		
the aircraft is temporarily not located in the hangar.		
2. Storing aircraft handling equipment e.g., tow bar, glider tow		
equipment, prefabricated metal shelving, workbenches, and cabinets		
and tools and materials used to service, maintain, repair, or outfit		
aircraft; items related to ancillary or incidental uses that do not affect		
the hangars' primary use.		
3. Storing materials related to an aeronautical activity, e.g., balloon		
and skydiving equipment, office equipment, teaching tools, and		
materials related to ancillary or incidental uses that do not affect the		
hangar's primary use.		
4. A reasonable amount of functional furniture only for use in the		
hangar such as a table and chairs.		
5. Spare aircraft tires, batteries, and trickle type battery charger with		
an automatic shutoff stored and maintained in accordance with		
relevant code.		
6. Refrigerators, air conditioners, fans and similar devices, as long		
as they are elevated 18" above the hangar floor and use no		
extension cords.		
7. Oily rags, oil waste, rags and other rubbish and trash, may only be		
stored in metal containers with self-closing, tight-fitting lids.		
8. Parking a vehicle in the hangar while the aircraft usually stored in		
the hangar is flying.		
9. Other items determined by the airport director to be allowable,		
based on their function and the personal needs of the occupant.		

Uses that are not permitted as defined by the FAA	Compliant	Non-Compliant
1. Use as a residence. Hangars shall not be used for the operation of		
a business or a business office, whether the business is aeronautical		
or non-aeronautical in nature. Storage of inventory or equipment		
supporting a private business function unrelated to the aeronautical		
USC.		
2. Activities that imped the movement of the aircraft in and out of the hangar or other aeronautical contents of the hangar.		
3. Storage of household items that could be stored in commercial		
storage facilities; long-term storage of derelict aircraft and parts;		
storage of items or activities prohibited by local or state law; storage		
of fuel or other dangerous Hazmat materials.		
4. Flammable liquids with flash points less than 100° are prohibited.		
This includes aviation fuel and most volatiles solvents.		
5. Combustible liquids with a flash points greater than 100° are		
limited to two gallons maximum. This includes diesel fuel, hydraulic		
fluid, motor oil and most lubricating oils.		
6. Portable aircraft and vehicle batteries may only be charged within		
an aircraft hangar while the aircraft owner or occupant is present,		
except for trickle type charges with an automatic shutoff. Stationary		
storage battery systems must be installed and maintained in		
accordance with applicable fire codes.
