MODIFICATION OF CERTAIN PERMIT, LAND USE APPLICATION, AND PUBLICATION FEES COLLECTED BY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT SERVICES, FIRE MARSHAL, AND PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, on September 7, 2010, the Board of County Commissioners passed Ordinance No. 2010-006, Revising Kittitas County Code (KCC) Regarding Transfer of Development Rights amending Sections 17.13, Transfer of Development Rights; 17.98, Amendments; 17.36, Planned Unit Development Zone; and 17.37, Master Planned Resorts; and

WHEREAS, on October 5, 2010, the Board of County Commissioners passed Resolution No. 2010-103 which modified certain permit, land use application, and publication fees collected by Community Development Services, Fire Marshal, and Public Works Department; and

WHEREAS, A Transfer of Development Rights (TDR) sending site application and fee are required by KCC 17.13.070 (2) "Responsibility for preparing a completed sending site application rests exclusively with the applicant. The fees for such application shall be as established annually by the Board of County Commissioners under separate action. Fees shall be payable to Kittitas County Community Development Services and shall not be returnable in any case;" and

WHEREAS, Kittitas County Community Development Services has found the TDR application fee should be established as shown in Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, On December 7, 2010, the Board of County Commissioners held a public hearing for public comment on the proposed TDR fees and heard testimony from all interested parties who wished to speak; and

WHEREAS, following the close of public testimony, the Board of County Commissioners deliberated on the issue; and

WHEREAS, following deliberation, the Board of County Commissioners voted to institute the TDR fees collected by Community Development Services and set said fees as described in Exhibit A.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Kittitas County Board of County Commissioners hereby rescinds Resolution 2010-103, and replaces it with this current resolution to include the addition of Transfer of Development Rights fees.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: by the Kittitas County Board of Commissioners that the fee schedule shown in "Exhibit A" for Kittitas County Community Development Services fees, is adopted and shall become effective December 10, 2010.

3 Access and address permits that are exempt from a fee include:

- Parcels in a subdivision where an access permit (one per subdivision) was approved for the subdivision. Access permits
 for subdivisions are needed to verify that Road Standards are met and roads are certified prior to issuance of a building
 permit. Owners of individual parcels will be required to obtain an address permit but not an access permit in new
 subdivisions with an approved access.
- Parcels that require an access onto State Routes, Forest Service roads, or Railroad easements require separate access permits from those agencies – the County cannot grant access to roads or easements it does not control.
- Parcels that have an approved access permit on file at the Public Works Department and are not proposing any access
 changes (change in type of access use or location of access). These permits are considered "grandfathered-in" regardless
 of whether or not they meet the requirements of KCC 12.05.
- 4. Parcels that do <u>not</u> have an approved access permit on file at the Public Works Department and are not proposing any access changes (change in type of access use or location of access), if one of these criteria are met:
 - a. The requirements of KCC 12.05 are met; or
 - b. The parcel was built prior to 2003.

⁴ Summary of KCC 10.16 Over-legal County permits: \$5/truck log tolerance, \$1/truck overload permits (seasonal - emergency), overweight is either \$5/truck minimum or rate per mile (table below), whichever is greater, \$3/trip for over-width or \$150 annual fee/vehicle for 12' max.
